## Montana

### CSBG NETWORK PARTICIPANTS

The Montana State Office administers CSBG funds to 10 Community Action Agencies in 100% of MT counties

In Montana, Community Action Agencies provided services to 89,343 low-income individuals.

62% of families served by the CSBG Network lived below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines

Vulnerable populations served included:

18% of families served in MT were in severe poverty, below 50% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines



Nationally, of the 6.9 million families served by the CSBG Network, 71.43% were living below 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Nationally, over 1,000 Community Action Agencies receiving CSBG funding provided services to 15.9 million individuals with low-incomes.

### CSBG NETWORK RESOURCES

For every \$1 of CSBG, the MT Network leveraged \$24.69 from federal, state, local, and private sources, including the value of volunteer hours\*



\$2,870,476 in CSBG funds were allocated in support of local entities in Montana.

The MT Network's non-CSBG funding totaled \$70,358,882.

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## CSBG PERFORMANCE OUTCOMES FOR MONTANA

Services and strategies provided by the MT Network resulted in **239,828 outcomes for participants and communities with low incomes.**

### Outcomes Include:

54,127

#### Employment

Participants with low incomes in CSBG Network employment initiatives obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to initial or continuous employment, acquired a job, increased their income, or achieved “living wage” employment and benefits.

39,126

#### Economic Asset Enhancement and Utilization

Households with low incomes increased their financial assets or financial skills.

10,598

#### Child and Family Development

Infants, children, youth, parents, and other adults participated in developmental or enrichment programs facilitated by the CSBG Network and achieved program goals.

35,845

#### Independent Living for Vulnerable Populations with Low Incomes

Vulnerable individuals with low incomes received services from the CSBG Network and secured or maintained an independent living situation as a result.

38,942

#### Family Stability

Participants with low incomes obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to family stability through assistance from the CSBG Network.

42,050

#### Emergency Assistance

Individuals and families with low incomes received emergency assistance from the CSBG Network.

8,479

#### Community Opportunities and Resources

Community opportunities or resources were improved or expanded for people with low incomes as a result of CSBG Network projects or initiatives, or partnerships with other public and private agencies.

#### Community Empowerment

Community members and people with low incomes mobilized to engage in activities that support and promote their own well-being and that of their community as a result of CSBG Network initiatives through maximum feasible participation.
