Community Spotlight: Veterans Navigation Network

Founded in 2019 by Army Ranger veteran Blake Fuhriman, VNN connects service members, veterans, and their families (SMVF) to vital services across Montana and beyond. With holistic, veteran-led support, VNN provides resource navgiation

case management, peer mentorship, and advocacy, serving over 1,500 veterans to date. In January 2025, VNN moved to the HRDC building to accommodate their growing team. Their

Key Programs & Initatives

VIGATION NETWORK

Warrior Bridge: Supports Native American veterans through culturally competent resource navigation, intensive case management, peer mentorship, and crisis intervention.

Family Connection: Offers spouses, caregivers, and children personalized support, including VA navigation, peer groups, and wellness events

Justice-Involved Veteran Program: Assists incarcerated and reentering veterans through reentry case management, court advocacy, peer mentorship, and behavioral health connections.

VetConnect events and resource fairs have connected nearly 2,500 SMVF since 2022 with services and fostered camaraderie through BBQs, wellness outings a new short film initiative featuring local veterans' stories. BHAC Veterans Subcommittee: leads statewide policy advisory group addressing veteran mental health challenges. Focus areas include PTSD, substance use, and community reintegration.

Montana Warriors Forward: drives Montana's statewide suicide prevention effort through leadership in the Governor's Challenge to end veteran suicide and its evolution into Warriors Forward.

Veteran Service Providers Network: Coordinates this Montana coalition, providing logistics, engagement, and shared learning to optimize services for veterans.
